

## THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to health and safety concerns resulting in the substantial operational impediments, and the proclamations of a states of emergency by federal, state, and local officials, it has been determined that the conditions described in section 68115 of the Government Code are met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of Amador. Upon the request of Presiding Judge J. S. Hermanson, it is ordered that the Superior Court of Amador County is authorized to do the following:

- Declare that from March 17, 2020 to March 31, 2020 be deemed holidays for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(4));
- Extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 17, 2020, to March 31, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(6)); and
- Extend by not more than 30 days the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire from March 17, 2020, to March 31, 2020, inclusive because the emergency condition described herein prevented the court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(7)).
