THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to health and safety concerns resulting in the substantial operational impediments, and the proclamations of a state of emergency by federal and state officials, it has been determined that the conditions described in section 68115 of the Government Code are met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of Yolo. Upon the request of Presiding Judge Samuel T. McAdam, it is ordered that the Superior Court of Yolo County is authorized to do the following:

- Declare that from 3/17/2020 to 4/1/2020, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing the time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(4));
- Declare that from 3/16/2020 to 4/1/2020, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing time under Welfare and Institutions Code section 334. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));
- Extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on from 3/17/2020 to 4/16/2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(6));
- Extend by not more than 30 days the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire because the emergency condition described herein prevented the court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered, applicable only to cases in which the restraining order otherwise would expire on from 3/17/2020 to 4/16/2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(7)),
- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 court days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on from 3/17/2020 to 4/8/2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9));

• Extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on from 3/16/2020 to 4/15/2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10));
